### Year 1 Flying Training Course for Secondary school Students

### Information 2016

For 2016 The BAC offers secondary school students a school holiday based Summer New Horizons program. The program provides students starting an initial Commercial Pilot License (CPL) aviation theory and flying training course.

The program covers the first part of a Certificate IV (AV140108) in Aviation and supports the Civil Aviation Safety Authority (CASA) syllabus for a Commercial Pilot Licence. The CPL is the basic and essential qualification required for a person to commence a career as a Commercial Pilot. The course may lead to employment as a pilot within the aviation industry which includes Airline, Charter, Flying Training, Emergency Services and many other aspects of the industry.



Students will receive a Statement of Attainment at the end of the year of the course. Successful completion of the Year 1 course may gain a credit of up to two units towards your VCE at a unit 3 and 4 sequences level. In addition VTAC may award students who receive Units 3 and 4 sequences though Block Credit Recognition, up to 10% towards their Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR). One or more unit credits towards a VCAL learning program may also be obtained upon completion of each 90 nominal hours of the curriculum. The course utilizes adult learning principles and individual attention and training.

#### Summer New Horizons Course

The Year 1 2016 Summer New Horizons course is organized by the BAC. Students attend the BAC Summer New Horizons aviation theory program outside normal school hours during the summer and Easter holiday breaks. Applications for the Summer New Horizons for 2016 close with the BAC on December 1 2015.

*\* Actual flying hours may be spread over a longer period of time and may include extra hours.*
